

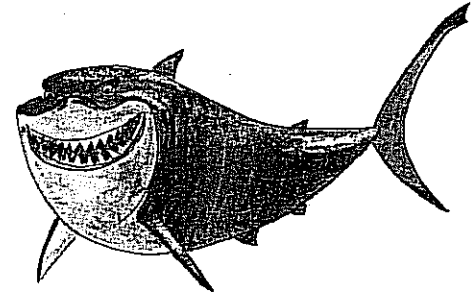

The overwhelming majority of adults in this country never learned to draw. When asked to draw a house, they draw the same one they drew at age 7. You may know that house. It's the square one with a door in the middle, a window on each side, two lollipop-looking trees in the yard, and smoke curling out the chimney. These adults were never exposed to the basics of fine art. That's what we teach.

Using a variety of media, (oil pastels, colored pencils, markers and crayons) young children begin to see the way that artists do, and have fun with individualized, non-competitive lessons. Because our students can see progress, they remain enthusiastic and motivated

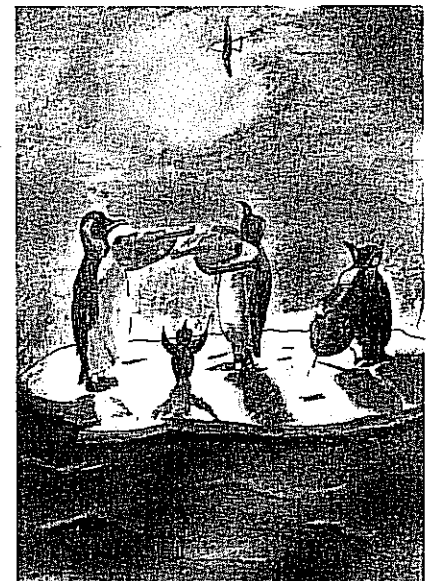
