## Reminders about attendance policy

The EWHS Attendance policy allows students no more than three unexcused absences in a given class per semester. If students exceed three unexcused absences, they will receive a "No Credit" grade for the course pending a successful appeal.

To avoid this situation, make sure all absences are excused by providing a note from a parent or guardian within 48 hours of returning to school.

Parents or guardians can also call the attendance office at 425-670-7919 to excuse an absence by telephone.

Students are allowed six unexcused absences from Warrior Period before losing credit, and there is no appeals process for Warrior Period.

## BUZZ in the BIZ....

**TOPIC:** *Why didn't you get that job?*

— I called on the phone to see if Company X was hiring. That showed the employer that I was too lazy to come in and pick up an application and inquire about job openings.

— I entered Company X requesting an application for employment with other job applications in my hand. That showed the employer that I was not particularly interested in “their” store, I just wanted a job.

— My application was incomplete and had spelling errors. And when I turned it in I was not smiling and cheerful. That showed the employer that I was not too excited about looking for work. Why would an employer want to hire someone not excited about working for their company?

— I was dressed sloppy and dirty. My jeans were falling off and I was wearing a hat and sunglasses and chewing gum. Would I want to hire me?

— I went into Company X with friends to see if they were hiring. That showed the employer that I was not too serious about seeking employment if I had to bring my friends with me.

— My application was not completely filled out. I left many spaces blank. That shows the employer that I do not know how to follow instructions.

## Get high school and college credit with Edmonds Tech Prep Program

The Edmonds Tech Prep Program is a *Dual Enrollment* program that allows high school students to take classes on their own campus and receive both high school and college professional/technical credit upon successful completion of certain courses.

The Tech Prep Program is a *plus* to a high school student's plan for college and beyond. Follow these four simple steps:

Step 1: **Enroll** in a Tech Prep class at your high school.

Step 2: **Register** online at <http://techprep.edcc.edu> .

Step 3: **Pay** the \$25-per-college annual program fee.

Step 4: **Earn** a B or better grade.

## For students desiring health care careers

Does your serious college-bound student have an interest in a career in health care after high school? Does your student aspire to be a nurse, a physician, a physical therapist, a pharmacist, a dental hygienist, a dentist or any number of other allied health career options?

How about working their way through college? Healthcare Professions: Nursing Assistant Training may be just the ticket! This program is job training meant to prepare students for entry level work in the health care arena.

Students who successfully complete the program qualify to take a state competency exam, which allows them to license as a Certified Nursing Assistant. From there, they may seek work in a variety of settings, such as a hospital, a skilled nursing facility, an assisted living facility, medical clinics and home care agencies. They can expect to earn several dollars above the minimum wage as a CNA as well.

This program is articulated with Edmonds Community College and students who maintain a B or better qualify to earn 16 college credits for a nominal processing fee.

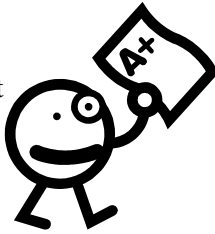

Sno-Isle Tech Skills Center is a public school offering technical training for high school students (juniors and seniors) from various school districts, including Edmonds.

**COURSE INFORMATION** - Sno-Isle Tech currently offers 23 courses in six different career pathways. Some of these include: Auto Maintenance, Business and Management, Cosmetology, Culinary Arts, Computer Programming, Dental Assisting, Veterinary Assisting, Welding and much, much more!

**COST** - There is no cost to students of member districts. Some courses require a lab or clothing fee (The Cosmetology Program has additional fees beyond what is paid by Sno-Isle)

**HOW TO ENROLL** - Contact your high school counselor for a Sno-Isle Tech application. Student interviews for 2005-2006 enrollment are March 9 and 10. Make up interviews are March 16 and 17. There will be an **OPEN HOUSE** on Feb. 8 from 6-8 p.m.

**INSTRUCTIONAL FORMAT** - Students are transported to Sno-Isle Tech from their home high school. Each student spends a half day at Sno-Isle and a half day at the home high school.

- Community and Technical Colleges have begun accepting applications for Fall Quarter 2005. Ask about scholarships and financial aid.

#### **INTRODUCING THE NEW SAT!**

The new SAT will be administered in March of 2005. Some colleges are opting to accept scores from either the current or new SAT. Therefore, it is imperative to find out which test will be accepted by your student's college(s) of interest. Many colleges will require the new SAT with writing for students graduating in 2006. We recommend that college-bound juniors take the SAT in May or June of this year.

#### **SAT Night a Success**

Many thanks to all those who braved the weather to find out about changes made to the SAT and ACT on Jan. 11. If your student has questions about the new SAT or the optional writing test, encourage them to see their counselor or ask an admissions officer at colleges they are thinking about applying to.

#### **PSAT**

PSAT results were distributed in January. With each test, students were handed back the actual test booklet to give them the opportunity to review the questions they did not answer correctly. The counselors provided an information and Q & A session for the PSAT test takers.

#### **Sophomores – Class of 2007**

##### **PLAN Test Results**

PLAN Test results were distributed to students in January. We recommend that you look over the "World of Work Map" with your student – this was an interest inventory which was given to your student during the PLAN test. It is a great way to look at your student's areas of interests and talk about possible career/education choices! This is located on the back of the PLAN score sheet.

#### **Freshman – Class of 2007**

##### **Report Cards**

Your student will soon receive his/her 1<sup>st</sup> report card from EWHS! Students who fail a core class (English, Pacific Rim or Integrated Math) should plan to repeat the course in our district summer school.

##### **Freshman Career Units**

The Counselors are continuing to visit freshman Fundamentals of Technology classes and present information regarding: graduation requirements, course selection, the path to graduation (fields of study and culminating project), and options after high school. Students will be required to show their 5-year plans to their parent/guardians and to obtain signatures. The plans will then be kept in your student's portfolio.

## District implements Safe Schools Tipline



The Edmonds School District has implemented an anonymous Safe Schools Tipline for parents and students. The phone number is 425-670-7010.

In a letter home to parents last month, Superintendent Nick J. Brossoit, Ed.D., noted that “when students become aware of unsafe people or situations, it can be very difficult for some to report as they are fearful or feel pressure from others to keep things secret.”

The Safe Schools Tipline allows students “to help us keep their schools safe, and to break the ‘code of silence’ with respect to matters that can impact the safety of their schools,” Brossoit said.

“If you or your student were to suspect or become aware of any students or adults in a school who are planning or acting in any unsafe way, please let us know. This includes, but is not limited to, the use or possession of drugs, knives, guns, and/or threats to injure, bully, or assault others,” he added.

The tipline is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and checked twice during each school day. “Tips” will be referred to school or law enforcement authorities.

### *CPC Committee Report:*

## Kindergarten changes, capital projects bond discussed

It is the unusual EWHS parent who will also have a kindergartener next fall, but for those special few, their little students will attend half-day, every day. No more awkward Tuesday/Thursday and Monday/Wednesday with half-day Friday schedules. (Try explaining that to a 5-year-old!)

The Edmonds School Board agreed with district staffers and the Citizen Planning Committee (CPC) Education Subcommittee that this model gives students the best academic start. Assistant Superintendent Pam Hopkins said some additional monies will be needed to pay for transportation and that all-day kindergarten is still a choice for an additional fee or for those using scholarship funds.
